
When a loved one passes away, Schnackenberg Funeral Home is available to help grieving families through some of the most difficult parts of the process.

Timbers Event Center

The Timbers Lodge is the new incarnation of the historic Eureka Community Hall building. After the building's purchase and renovation by six members of the Casazza family, The Timbers Lodge now houses two businesses - Timbers Event Center and The Gathering Place Coffee Shop. Both businesses aim to serve the community in different ways, echoing the building's original purpose.

Three couples who share the Casazza name - Lucas and Kristi, Eric and Shawnna, and Larry and Mary Beth - purchased the building in 2021 from the retiring owner of Lodgecraft Furniture, who had stewarded the building for 30 years. With the building's renovation, the Casazzas had the priority of honoring the building's historic legacy and function.

In 1935, Eureka residents conceived the idea for the community center, and in ensuing years were able to raise half of the needed funds despite challenges of the Great Depression. Construction of the rustic style log building, now listed on the National Register of Historic Places, began in 1939 and completed in 1942, with funding assistance from the Works Project Administration. In the NRHP application the building is described as "the most substantial and well-crafted building in Eureka."

The Timbers Event Center occupies the east side of the building. It is available for rent and is ideal for weddings and other family events such as reunions, anniversaries, birthday parties, and baby showers. The Eureka Players have performed at the center a number of times. "We continue to maintain a strong relationship with the theater group," Larry says. The remodel included air conditioning, lighting, and a sound system, and functions well for ticketed performance events or lectures.

The Gathering Place Coffee Shop occupies the west side of the building. This warm and welcoming







In 1948, electricity to rural areas was only a dream for many. Since the customer density was low, for-profit electric companies did not want to invest in installing the infrastructure to serve so few members. So residents of our communities took matters into their own hands and banded together to create Lincoln Electric Cooperative, Inc. They received pledges from neighbors to commit to the project and requested funding through the Rural Electrification Act.

Through the hard work and dedication of our members, Lincoln Electric energized our first service in November 1949. In the intervening years, Lincoln Electric has grown to serve over 4,900 members with over 6,200 meters on 984 miles of line in portions of Lincoln and Flathead counties. Rural Propane is a for-profit company that operates like a non-profit. Propane rates are set to cover expenses; not to make a profit. In fact, any excess revenue collected above the total expense is returned to Lincoln Electric and our members.

Rural Propane provides new tank sets for residential and commercial properties and scheduled tank fills. They perform free annual propane safety




