


The featured artists will be Tim Helnore, Patrick McCurry and Jessica Hill and several more local artists.

David Thompson Black Powder Shoot

he Tobacco River Muzzleloaders invite everyone to the David Thompson Black Powder Shoot, 1.5 miles north of the intersection of Highways 37 and 93, on the west side of Highway 93 N., across from the Indian Springs Ranch entrance.

Events run Friday and Saturday from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. and on Sunday from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. The public is welcome all day and every day of the shoot. Visitors also are welcome to visit and stroll through the Primitive Campground.

The event promotes the black powder sport and the

fact that David Thompson was the first non-native to come through the area and map it.







Community Play

he Eureka Community Players are bringing back their traditional old time melodrama for the Eureka Rendezvous weekend. "No Opera at the Op'ry House Tonight or Too Good to Be True" by Tim Kelley is a full-length melodrama with all the wonderful characters that we all expect to see in melodramas: a hero, a heroine, a villain and all the great and funny people that fill out the cast.

An old-fashioned melodrama written with a fast, contemporary flair, "No Opera at the Op'ry House Tonight" is set in the Arizona Territory during the 1890s. The Salami Opera Company is about to fall part in the dusty hamlet of Desert Rat. And that foul villain, Baron Wolfgang von Wolfpack, knows that the prima donna, Alma Pumpernickle, is about to inherit a fortune in gold mines. He'd force her to marry him at once except that she has no title, and the family pride prevents him from marrying a commoner. To solve his dilemma, he enlists the aid of a notorious confidence woman, Lily Liverspot. It is she who discovers that the young

nobleman, Count Omitt, is living incognito as Billy Bright, a composer so poor he cannot afford a piano, so he hums. Lily, through shady means, schemes to have the young people married so Alma will have a title. After an annulment, Wolfpack will be able to marry her and claim her unsuspected wealth. Lily arranges a hilarious marriage, but before Wolfpack can claim his prize, he must reckon with the outrageous Madame Violetta (whose operatic performance "must be heard to be depreciated"). The action climaxes with hilarity!

Twists and turns, booing and hissing, cheering and applauding all add up to a fun-filled show for the whole family.

Performances are Friday April 28 and Saturday, April 29 at 7 p.m. Sunday's show is at 3 p.m. All performances are at the Timbers Event Center. Tickets are \$10 for adults, \$8 for children and seniors. Tickets are available at the door.

Sip on hot coffee while enjoying a hearty breakfast. All proceeds go towards the running and improvement of the center throughout the year.


